Planned Parenthood affiliates (franchisees) are well known as the leader in the U.S. abortion industry. A complementary mission of Planned Parenthood is promotion of promiscuity to children. I became aware of this fact through Pro-Life Waco challenges to a Waco Planned Parenthood youth conference called Nobody's Fool. While my initial concern was our local Planned Parenthood affiliate, I soon learned about the common ground with Planned Parenthood Federation of America (PPFA) and International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF). I have tried to shine the light on print publications such as the book It's Perfectly Normal (endorsed by PPFA and distributed by Waco Planned Parenthood) and Healthy, Happy and HOT (published by IPPF). I've also pointed to websites such as TeenWire.com (PPFA) and TakeCareDownThere.org from the affiliate in Columbia-Willamette, Washington. My initiatives to shine the light on TakeCareDownThere have not been particularly successful. One reason is the content is so vile that most decent people simply do not want to expose themselves to viewing and listening to the content. I hope that more will be willing to read the transcripts. We must face the sordid reality of Planned Parenthood if we are going to mobilize to defend children who are in the crosshairs of this organization. Reading these transcripts will not be enjoyable. I assure you that creating this document was not enjoyable.

TakeCareDownThere is the degrading creation of a local Planned Parenthood affiliate in the state of Washington. The website attempts to be light-hearted and is visually attractive. The main theme is that sexually active (promiscuous) teens should have themselves checked frequently for sexually transmitted infections. The provider of these SDI check-ups would be a local Planned Parenthood affiliate. The revenue-seeking slant of this website can hardly be missed.

TakeCareDownThere is a series of vignettes involving an adult and several teen actors. I give the characters names in the transcripts. The adult is Mr. Sexpert. Slovenly dressed and poorly groomed, Mr. Sexpert intrudes on the lives of the teens to give advice to help them continue their "anything goes" sexuality. The teen girls are Amy, Melissa, and Tara. There are two boys—Terence who is black and Scott who is white. Race is significant since one vignette features Terence performing oral sex on Scott.

The portrayal of sexual content is not highly graphic. We do see a girl and boy making out and drawings of how to use a condom. Otherwise, "the action" has just occurred or is off-screen. Nevertheless, Planned Parenthood's advocacy of unfettered sex comes through clearly with affirmations of vaginal intercourse, oral sex, and masturbation for fun loving teens.

The transcripts below are slightly edited to avoid unnecessary banter.

Vignette #1: Find the STI

We were born to be in love with our bodies.

Ask any three-year-old.

But somewhere down the road to growing up, we put our reproductive selves in the dark.

Rather than worry about what went wrong, we should remember it is never too late to know ourselves.

After all, we are ultimately in charge of our bodies.

It may be the most important responsibility we have. Starting today, let's make a pact: to make our bodies our best friend.

So that when we make decisions, we are empowered and aware.

And let's promise to pass that power on my asking everyone to join us.

And, take care down there!

Planned Parenthood's "TakeCareDownThere" in Perspective

The pathetic transcripts of **TakeCareDownThere** speak clearly for themselves. I comment on just a few passages.

In vignette #2, Mr. Sexpert reacts to a joking reference to a horse by countering "A horse is a majestic animal." Taken as a whole, the transcripts offer more dignity to horses than to young boys and girls. There is nothing majestic in the promiscuity-promoting advice of **TakeCareDownThere**.

Planned Parenthood claims that their comprehensive sex education promotes abstinence. The Planned Parenthood version of sex education is often called "Abstinence Plus." We can see in **TakeCareDownThere** that Planned Parenthood is all about "the Plus." In vignette #6, abstinence is called a "beautiful thing" in the context of uninhibited masturbation. Mr. Sexpert goes on to state that masturbation can make a girl feel "like a virgin again." True abstinence or chastity gets zero affirmation in **TakeCareDownThere**.

Much has been written about the racist history and character of Planned Parenthood. (The documentary **Maafa 21** from Life Dynamics gives a powerful account of how diminishing of the black population has been pursued first through sterilization, and later through contraception and abortion). The portrayal in **TakeCareDownThere** of a black teen performing oral sex on a white boy fits well within the racist character of Planned Parenthood.

The slide show of vignette #8 captures the Planned Parenthood vision of youth sexual expression in a nutshell. The goal of children in making decisions is to be "empowered and aware." Sex is about having knowledge and personal power. Morality and virtue is off the radar screen.

Vignette #5 makes a statement about avoiding risk. If a condom does not roll down appropriately, just toss it out, "We don't take chances with anything that is contaminated." In the whole of **TakeCareDownThere**, risk avoidance never leads to any hesitation about sexual encounters. The website never questions whether engaging in particular acts—with multiple partners who also have multiple partners—are worth the risk. For **TakeCareDownThere**, the green light for sexual engagement is always on, provided there is risk reduction. However, even with condom use and STI testing, significant risk remains. A young boy or girl may well be damaged severely with an STI or HIV. The revenue position of Planned Parenthood, however, is always enhanced by promotion of promiscuity.

TakeCareDownThere reiterates the "get tested" message for sexually-active youngsters. However, nothing is said about what will happen if an STI is

contracted. Two issues arise with a positive STI diagnosis: treatments and sexual conduct. What treatments will be provided and what are the effects of various treatments? Dealing with this topic would have conflicted with the "sex is so much fun" message of **TakeCareDownThere**. Another concern for a child with an STI is what alterations would be called for in sexual conduct. Regarding this question, a clear position has been presented by International Planned Parenthood Federation in their January 2010 publication, Healthy, Happy and HOT. IPPF gives the shocking counsel to HIV-positive youngsters that they need not limit their sexual behavior and that the HIVinfected person has no obligation to reveal this fact to sex partners. In the words of IPPF, "Some countries have laws which say people living with HIV must tell their sexual partner(s) about their status before having sex.... These laws violate the rights of people living with HIV.....There are many reasons that people do not share their HIV status."

Reading the scripts or seeing the vignettes of **TakeCareDownThere** is a shocking, demeaning and also necessary. Concern for our children and grandchildren requires that we fight back. To win the battle we must have thorough understanding of our adversaries. We must see through this corrupting content to the underlying strategies of Planned Parenthood. **TakeCareDownThere** reveals the following strategies for influencing children:

- Present sex in a frivolous, flippant manner.
- Diminish any sense of modesty in young girls as well as boys.
- "You can be the lucky one." Try to convince each youngster that he or she can dodge the unwelcome impacts of a promiscuous life-style by partaking in Planned Parenthood advice and services.
- Tell teens (and preteens) that sex is all about being healthy, happy, and in control. Ignore virtue and morality.
- If Planned Parenthood does get into morality, aggressive moral relativism and personal autonomy is affirmed. What is right or wrong is strictly a matter of personal choice. There are no universal, binding principles of right and wrong.
- Give children more to think about and act upon.
 Lead them on by presenting new options and further steps to take in their demeaning sexual journeys.
- Give the impression that "everybody's doing it."
- Promote Planned Parenthood as THE trusted source on sex!! When Mr. Sexpert is not around, teens can always get advice and "services" without their parents' knowledge but paid with their parents' taxes.
