- Weekly: Rise Up on Ross Ave.

The first Sunday of each month is **Life Chain Sunday** from 2-3 p.m. at the intersection of Valley Mills & Waco Drive. We hold "G-rated" signs to present the reality of abortion to the Waco community.

For our **Second Sunday Pro-Life Fellowship**, 60-100 pro-lifers come together at St. Mary's Parish Hall for a noon-hour meal, fellowship, and a meeting from 1-2 p.m. for education and action planning. The meal relies upon the Italian recipes of mama Rosa Pisciotta.

Rise Up at Ross is our outreach to help save lives and souls on the abortion days in Waco. The day changes from time to time. Currently the day is Thursday. Rev. Ronnie Holmes of Church of the Open Door leads this ministry. The next day she talked to her pregnant friend and showed the flyers. The mom chose life for her pre-born baby!



Planned Parenthood closes & relocates abortion business

The good news of the first days of 2012 was that, after 18 years and 18,000 deaths, the Planned Parenthood abortion facility at 1927 Columbus Avenue closed. The bad news was that the abortion operation was relocated to PP's last remaining facility at 1121 Ross Avenue.



This "consolidation" was announced as a cost saving measure. For our side, the Ross facility offers more opportunity for sidewalk counseling. Also, with all client interactions under one roof, this shatters the claim of a "wall of separation" between PP Waco's abortion and non-abortion businesses.

Our first response to Planned Parenthood retrenchment was a special Roe week memorial on January 21. We began with "An Hour of Remembrance" at the shuttered Columbus Ave. facility to honor those lost in the holocaust of past years. Speakers offered remembrances as counselors for life and as women who entered with the intention of aborting their babies. Then



Our spring 40 Days for Life prayer vigil brought something old and something new. The old was that our participation continued from the first national 40 Days for Life in 2007. The new was that the vigil was at the Ross Avenue facility since the Columbus Avenue killing center closed at the end of 2011.

The main focus of 40 Days for Life was prayer and public witness outside of Planned Parenthood during their hours of operation. With many children participating in public witness, one fun activity was hopscotch.



We cannot know the full impact of our prayers. We did experience the joy of seeing some abortion-minded moms turn from death to life for their little ones.

The prayer vigil was amplified by 40 Days for Life billboards, yard signs, t-shirts, and bracelets.


40 Days for Life will be back in 2013 beginning on Feb. 13. Can you plan to join in?

Vote Pro-Life Campaign

The exclamation mark was a half-page ad in the local newspaper the Saturday before the election. Nationally, election results were a letdown. Mega-affiliate gobbles up Planned Parenthood Waco



Last year, the embattled Planned Parenthood Waco became a branch of Planned Parenthood Austin.

Well, the merger mania in Planned Parenthood continues. In September of 2012, Planned Parenthood in Waco became part of one of Planned Parenthood's largest affiliates.

The name is Planned Parenthood of Greater Texas. This affiliate stretches from Austin through Waco and DFW to the Oklahoma boarder and east to Tyler. PFGT has 26 clinics.

What does the diminished status of Planned Parenthood in Waco mean for their future? This is uncertain. We will continue to challenge Planned Parenthood at every turn with hope and prayer that Planned Parenthood will close completely in Waco.

Nobody's Fool: Version 23

The big news is that, by our count, no more than 70 youngsters attended the 23rd annual Nobody's Fool on July 18. This contrasts to their claim of 300. Our yard sign, billboard, radio ad, and letter-to-the-editor campaigns have had a major impact. The central message of our campaign has been "Take the high road. Just abstain from Planned Parenthood Nobody's Fool."



On the morning of Nobody's Fool, we had at least five-dozen pro-lifers on-site with signs and literature. After one persuasive conversation

with Ruby McCray, One mom went back into the Convention Center to remove her two daughters from Nobody's Fool's.

Once the children entered Nobody's Fool's, Monica Cline delivered a speech and news conference.



Monica was an instructor for Nobody's Fool in 2007 and 2008. She later saw the light on the damaging messages of Planned Parenthood for children. She offered a very unique and eye-opening perspective.

After receiving gems of wisdom from Monica Cline, the whole pro-life gang walked across Franklin Avenue to a restaurant for brunch. Spirits were high.

Counter-Rally to Planned Parenthood's Texas bus tour

We had just one day's notice to plan a counter-rally to the Planned Parenthood's statewide bus-tour stop in Waco. The March 7 event in Waco was called a "Rally to Defend Women's Health." The actual purpose was to protect their taxpayer funding.



On short notice, 75 pro-life faithful appeared during the noon hour for this "Rumble on Ross Avenue." This was just as many as those on the Planned Parenthood side. One dedicated pro-lifer participated in a wheel chair!

Before, during, and after PP's feeble attempt, we held signs. We talked to people on the other side. We did not disrupt.

The rally and our counter-rally were covered by the Waco Tribune Herald and KXXV television news.
