In 2013, God blessed the Waco pro-life movement with two huge victories!

- The suspension of abortions at Waco Planned Parenthood.
- The termination of the Nobody's Fool annual "sex ed" conference for Waco children.

PP suspends abortions in Waco!

Planned Parenthood's abortion business in Waco has been "suspended" since the end of August 2013! Planned Parenthood Waco is not committing abortions at 1121 Ross Avenue. **HOWEVER**, Planned Parenthood intends to remain open at Ross Ave. to arrange abortions at other locations, provide birth control, deal with STDs, promote promiscuity, etc. So, we can offer two cheers—but definitely not three.

Amid widespread community opposition, Planned Parenthood Waco began abortions on January 10, 1994. In 2000, chemical abortions were added to surgical killing. In its nearly 20-year reign of terror, Planned Parenthood killed close to 20,000 innocent baby boys and girls.

In 2013, Pro-Life Waco soared to new levels for the mission to end abortion in our city. Our sidewalk-counseling ministry almost doubled. The goal was to divert moms from PP to CareNet. Radio ads were aired on KBW Christian radio and secular radio. We displayed more billboards than ever—one just 200 feet from PP. Our newspaper escalation included a quarter-page color ad showing the yearly death toll at the hands of Planned Parenthood Waco. Space does not permit mentioning more actions.

After being closed for two months, Planned Parenthood finally announced on Halloween that its abortion business in Waco was closed. They claim this resulted from the Texas HB2 law that required an abortionist have admitting privileges to a hospital within 30 miles of the abortion facility. However, this does not explain why they had closed in August. Planned Parenthood stated they may reopen for abortions in Waco if federal courts strike down key provisions of HB2.

I do not expect abortions to resume in Waco. I do expect Planned Parenthood to try to remain open for non-abortion "services", which are so threatening to our children and our community. **Pro-Life Waco will intensify outreach in 2014 with the goal of achieving full closure of Planned Parenthood.** Three years ago Planned Parenthood operated four separate "clinics." Three are now closed and abortions are suspended! Thank you to all who prayed, worked, wrote, encouraged, donated, etc. to bring these results.

PP pulls plug on Nobody's Fool!



Planned Parenthood Waco "aborted" the 23-year run of Nobody's Fool as reported on April 12 by KWTV-TV. Nobody's Fool was a one-day summer sex-ed program marketed to children entering grades 5 through 9.

Nobody's Fool was the first Planned Parenthood program of its kind in the U. S. Planned Parenthood in Waco regarded Nobody's Fool as its hallmark achievement.

For two decades, pro-lifers worked to shine the light on Nobody's Fool. Pro-Life Waco created a website,

www.plannedpromiscuity.com, to expose the reality of Planned Parenthood "sex education."

The shuttering of Nobody's Fool came on the heels of our campaign to convince the Waco YMCA to disinvite a Planned Parenthood speaker from YMCA's April 6 Girl's Day 2013. YMCA leadership capitulated in less than 48 hours.

Strategies for the annual challenge to Nobody's Fool included yard signs, billboards, the billboard truck, letters to the editor, radio ads, and dozens of pro-lifers at the Waco Convention Center site. Some held signs. Others counseled parents to turn away. This frequently succeeded. In one case, a mom turned from her intended child drop off to holding a sign in our demonstration.

In 2009, Pro-Life Waco first unveiled its iconic billboard truck at Nobody's Fool. Nobody's Fool was frequently the occasion of a press conference to expose some facet of the reality of Planned Parenthood. For the Fool conference's dying gasp in 2012, Monica Cline of Cedar Park delivered a press conference. Cline was a Nobody's Fool instructor in 2008 and 2009 prior to her conversion.

The height of Nobody's Fool tension came in 2004 when Pro-Life Waco launched a boycott of Girl Scout cookie sales. Waco's

Bluebonnet Girl Scout Council sponsored Nobody's Fool for several years. The boycott exploded into a national story—resulting in features on NBC's Today Show, O'Reilly Factor, CBN's 700 Club, etc. Following a two-week torrent of controversy, the Waco Girl Scout affiliate cut all ties with Planned Parenthood Waco.

The demise of Nobody's Fool was not a total surprise. Pro-Life Waco counted just 65 youths entering the Waco Convention Center in 2012. Planned Parenthood claimed that past yearly attendance reached over 500.

Waco "Blues" invade Austin for HB2 legislative battle

Planned Parenthood Waco's abortion facility is closed. Most likely, this would not have happened in 2013 without the leadership in Austin to enact the HB2 pro-life law. We did our part by putting on our **blue shirts** and carpooling to Austin to help show that Texans Stand4Life. Our biggest presence in Austin was on Tuesday, July 9 when the Texas House passed HB2 in the second Special Session. We were part of the overwhelmingly blue House Gallery. Our Representative Doc Anderson called the following day to thank us for showing our pro-life colors. What a tremendous pro-life, pro-family collaboration we have in the great state of Texas!

Best little pro-life fair booth in Texas

October is Respect Life Month and also the time for the Heart of Texas Fair in Waco. Under the leadership of Doel Garcia, PLW delivered another pro-life booth. Smiling children received over 2,000 "Choose Life" balloons. Thousands of fairgoers enjoyed the materials, photos, and models of life in the womb. Dozens of pro-lifers enjoyed working at the booth. How is that for a win-win experience?

With materials distributed, beautiful visuals of preborn life, and many conversations, the pro-life booth sows seeds of respect and support for the preborn and their moms.

"Carolyn" gets new messages



Second Sunday Pro-Life Gathering: More & Better

The central organizing and motivating event of Pro-Life Waco is Second Sunday Pro-Life Gathering at St. Mary's Parish Hall. In September, we recognized the 13-year anniversary of Second Sunday.

We begin each Second Sunday with a noon hour meal prepared under the direction of Chef Giovanni. With attendance growing from less than 20 in the early years to over 80, that's a lot of pasta and meatballs.

An education and action-planning meeting follows from 1 to 2 p.m.

We had several outstanding speakers:

March: Joe Pojman, Executive Director of Texas Alliance for Life in Austin, provided a preview of the year's pro-life legislative game plan. Wow! Joe's leadership in Austin made a huge difference. Anyone heard of the HB2 law?

September: Jim Sedlak, Vice-President of American Life League of Stafford, Virginia. Jim spoke about ways to challenge Planned Parenthood, drawing on his decades-long experience researching this pernicious organization. Jim Sedlak provided guidance to Pro-Life Waco from its inception.

October: Brandi Dudley of Tyler and Silent No More Awareness delivered her moving testimony on the impact of abortion on her life and a passionate encouragement for healing outreach to post-abortive women.

THRIVE!

Thrive! is a Christian sex education outreach launched with great success in 2012. In Waco, **Thrive!** is a collaboration among the Catholic Diocese of Austin, St. Louis Church, and CareNet Pregnancy Center of Central Texas. Two types of programs have been offered: first for adults in nurturing relationships with children and also directly for youths.

In 2013, **Thrive!** delivered an outstanding youth program the evening of December 6 at St. Louis Church. The chastity speaker was Matt Fradd, a colleague of Jason Everett who delivered the program in 2012.

Pro-Life Waco has assisted **Thrive!** with fundraising and promotion.
